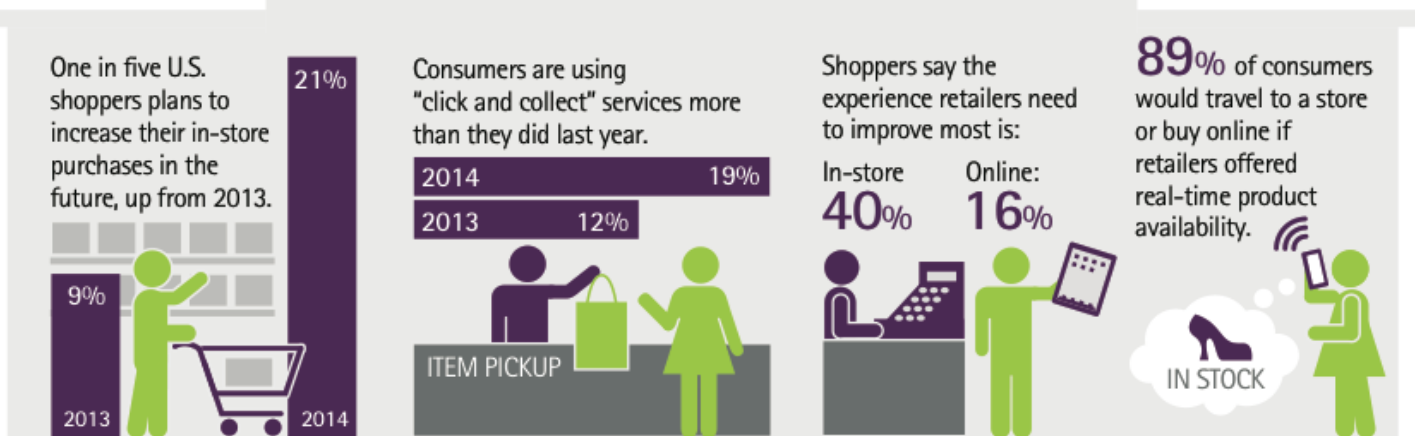

72% bought online after browsing at a store.



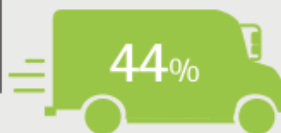
Free Beats Speed In Delivery Preferences

23% preferred to pay a reasonable charge for next day delivery.



44% expected a free delivery purchase to only take 1-5 days to arrive; up from 25% in 2013.

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
